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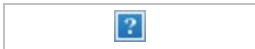

Hi Cory, hope you are well.

I'm writing with some serious issues regarding USPS' test distribution effort. My boss appreciates USPS' speed in deploying this effort, but he is deeply concerned about these matters so we would appreciate a timely response. Though I'm sure you're slammed right now, we very much appreciate the attention.

1. The "fine print" on the test-ordering site says that information gathered by ordering tests, obviously including name and address, can be used for law enforcement and ICE purposes. However, on USPS' FAQ [page](#) regarding this effort, USPS states "Your information will only be used to send you your free COVID-19 test order." Can USPS confirm it will not be sharing test-ordering data with law enforcement and/or ICE? My colleague Lavanya Sridharan, cc'ed, handles immigration policy for Senator Wyden and may weigh in with the impacts of collecting that data on public health measures such as test distribution and combatting the pandemic more broadly.
2. Many people in rural areas receive mail at business Post Office Boxes or contract POBs, as

they live outside of address delivery range. Unfortunately, USPS is not sending tests to Commercial Mail Receiving Agency, General Delivery addresses, or business POBs. Further it's unclear if contract POBs can receive tests. Such a policy quite successfully excludes a wide swath of Americans from this test delivery effort—and these are Americans already likely to live farther from public testing sites that USPS points folks to when they are unable to receive tests.

- a. Why is USPS unable to deliver to business PO Boxes when it can deliver tests to normal POBs?
- b. How will USPS rectify this issue to ensure rural Americans are not unfairly excluded from this testing program?

I understand that many of the contours of this program were guided by the White House. If you believe these questions are better addressed to them, please let me know. Thanks very much for your prompt attention to these concerns. I am available to hop on the phone at any point if a call would be easier for you.

I'm writing with some serious issues regarding USPS' test distribution effort. My boss appreciates USPS' speed in deploying this effort, but he is deeply concerned about these matters so we would appreciate a timely response. Though I'm sure you're slammed right now, we very much appreciate the attention.

1. The "fine print" on the test-ordering site says that information gathered by ordering tests, obviously including name and address, can be used for law enforcement and ICE purposes. However, on USPS' FAQ [page](#) regarding this effort, USPS states "Your information will only be used to send you your free COVID-19 test order." Can USPS confirm it will not be sharing test-ordering data with law enforcement and/or ICE? My colleague Lavanya Sridharan, cc'ed, handles immigration policy for Senator Wyden and may weigh in with the impacts of collecting that data on public health measures such as test distribution and combatting the pandemic more broadly.
2. Many people in rural areas receive mail at business Post Office Boxes or contract POBs, as they live outside of address delivery range. Unfortunately, USPS is not sending tests to Commercial Mail Receiving Agency, General Delivery addresses, or business POBs. Further it's unclear if contract POBs can receive tests. Such a policy quite successfully excludes a wide swath of Americans from this test delivery effort—and these are Americans already likely to live farther from public testing sites that USPS points folks to when they are unable to receive tests.
  - a. Why is USPS unable to deliver to business PO Boxes when it can deliver tests to normal POBs?
  - b. How will USPS rectify this issue to ensure rural Americans are not unfairly excluded from this testing program?

I understand that many of the contours of this program were guided by the White House. If you believe these questions are better addressed to them, please let me know. Thanks very much for your prompt attention to these concerns. I am available to hop on the phone at any point if a call would be easier for you.

My boss appreciates USPS' speed in deploying this effort, but he is deeply concerned about these matters so we would appreciate a timely response. Though I'm sure you're slammed right now, we very much appreciate the attention.

1. The "fine print" on the test-ordering site says that information gathered by ordering tests, obviously including name and address, can be used for law enforcement and ICE purposes. However, on USPS' FAQ [page](#) regarding this effort, USPS states "Your information will o our free COVID-19 test

order.” Can USPS confirm it will not be sharing test-ordering data with law enforcement and/or ICE? My colleague Lavanya Sridharan, cc’ed, handles immigration policy for Senator Wyden and may weigh in with the impacts of collecting that data on public health measures such as test distribution and combatting the pandemic more broadly.

2. Many people in rural areas receive mail at business Post Office Boxes or contract POBs, as they live outside of address delivery range. Unfortunately, USPS is not sending tests to Commercial Mail Receiving Agency, General Delivery addresses, or business POBs. Further it’s unclear if contract POBs can receive tests. Such a policy quite successfully excludes a wide swath of Americans from this test delivery effort—and these are Americans already likely to live farther from public testing sites that USPS points folks to when they are unable to receive tests.
